- **4** Explain what is meant by *ethnographic observation*. Indicate its purpose, and briefly describe its main phases: preparation, field study, analysis, and reporting. [10 points]
- **5** Briefly explain what is meant by *direct manipulation*, give a concrete example of direct manipulation in a computer interface that you are familiar with, and briefly discuss three problems with direct manipulation.

- **6** Explain what is meant by *virtual reality* and by *augmented reality*. For each of them, give an example of existing or potential application (describe each example in 2-4 lines). [10 points]
- 7 Consider cultural and international diversity. Give five examples of *user-interface concerns or items* for *internationalization* (such as date and time formats). [5 points]
